

RENTAL PROPERTY CERTIFICATE OF HABITABILITY GUIDELINES

- Who is Required to have a Certificate of Habitability?
 - Anyone renting any type of residential unit in the Borough of Mendham
- Cost
 - o \$150.00 per each rental unit
 - Annual Renewal or Change in Tenant
 - \$75.00 per unit
- Registration and/or Annual Renewal Form
 - The registration fee must be submitted for <u>each unit</u> with the Registration Form
 - o Submit:

- Names of all tenants, apartment/unit numbers and unit floor plans that include all sleeping rooms <u>must</u> be provided as requested on the Registration Form.
 - This information is required for public safety purposes

in the event of a fire or disaster as well as for your own legal protection.

- Required Inspection
 - Schedule an inspection of the rental property with the Code Enforcement Department
 - If the rental property passes inspection, a Certificate of Habitability will be issued.
 - If the rental property does not pass inspection, you will be given <u>30 days</u> to correct the violations.
 - When the repairs are made the property owner or agent must notify the inspector and schedule a re-inspection.
 - o Re-inspection Fee \$50.00 each unit.
 - If the property passes the re-inspection, a Certificate of Habitability will be issued.

How Long Is My License Good For?

- A new license is required annually <u>or</u> whenever there is a change in tenant/occupancy.
- Tenant lists are also required to be submitted annually or whenever there is a change in tenant.

What Happens If I Do Not Have A Certificate Of Habitability?

- If you do not have a Certificate of Habitability and are renting out a property, <u>you are operating an illegal</u> <u>rental unit.</u>
- As the property owner, <u>YOU</u> are responsible for ensuring that you hold a current Certificate of Habitability for each rental unit that you own and rent.
- Failure to possess a valid Certificate of Habitability will result in a municipal summons subject to a penalty of up to \$2,000.00.
