

Borough of Mendham Police Department

The Borough of Mendham Police Department enforces all criminal, local and motor vehicle laws of the State of New Jersey here in the Borough to keep our community and streets safe. The officers routinely patrol the Borough's business and residential areas looking for suspicious activity to prevent crime and assist our residents. The police department also provides additional services, such as child car seat installation/inspection, vacant house checks, community crime prevention programs, safety programs, school programs such as LEAD and tours for local scouting organizations. The Borough police officers respond to ALL emergency calls including fire and first-aid calls. Police patrol cars are equipped with first-aid equipment including defibrillators. Several police officers are also EMT certified.

Police Department's Business Office hours are Monday-Friday 9:00 am to 4:00 pm (excluding holidays). To file a police report or speak with an officer, call any time of day or night, seven days a week. There is no need to wait for the business office to open. The patrol officers on duty are always willing to assist and speak with you. Just request the dispatcher to have an officer call you or stop by at your location.

Formed in 1905, the Mendham Fire Department provides volunteer fire protection, rescue, and fire-prevention education to the over 5,000 residents of and visitors to the Borough of Mendham. We operate out of one station that protects a primarily residential area of about six square miles.

We respond to an average of over 250 calls each year and are always looking for volunteers to serve as our next generation of firefighters. However, being a member doesn't always involve fighting a fire or going through the necessary training to respond to every alarm. We have several members from the community who serve the department in a variety of roles and responsibilities. We gladly accept anyone who wants to help by donating their time and energy to keep our town, our neighborhoods, and our families safe. There is a job for everyone who wants to be involved.

Domestic Animals

Contact ACS directly for all domestic animal issues (dogs and cats), including loose, stray, dangerous and injured domestic animals. ACS is required to shelter unclaimed domestic animals at their facility when necessary. All sheltering costs are the owner's responsibility and will be charged accordingly. Every effort will be made by ACS to locate the owner prior to sheltering.

Deceased Animals (Non-Deer)

ACS will not remove deceased animals from private property. ACS will only remove deceased animals from municipal roadways and properties, excluding deer.

Deceased Deer




Mendham Area Senior Transportation Services (MAST)





Black Horse Pub and Tavern




The oldest continuing food establishment in New Jersey, as both an inn and restaurant has sat at the Black Horse's present location since the early eighteenth century. Originally the farmhouse home of Ebenezer Byram, it was opened as tavern to travelers in 1742. Stop in and enjoy a wonderful meal and history!

Hilltop Cemetery

Situated on one of the highest points in of the center the Borough, Hilltop Cemetery was established in 1777. It lies on gradually sloping ground behind Hilltop Presbyterian Church with beautiful views over the Borough. Tied to the Borough of Mendham and revolutionary war history it is the resting place of 27 Revolutionary War soldiers. The Hilltop Cemetery is а nondenominational resting place and is used by Presbyterian, Catholic and Methodist congregations. Website: hilltopcemetery.com

The Phoenix House, constructed around 1800, originated as an academy for young ladies. Shortly after the completion of the Washington Turnpike around 1806, William Phoenix purchased the building for use as an inn. From 1857 to 1907 it was used by his daughters as a genteel boarding house—though legend has it that Miss Phoenix continued to sell liquor through a side-door in the kitchen. The building is a fine example of the Federal style, with a Greek Revival-style porch added in 1840. Since 1938, the Phoenix House has been the home of the Borough of Mendham Municipal Offices. Visitors are welcome to spend a little time in the peaceful Phoenix Garden, maintained by the Mendham Garden Club.
