### Mayor's Update

Dear Residents and Business Owners:

Happy New Year! I hope your holiday season was enjoyable and that 2010 is a terrific year for all of us.

The new face you might have seen riding around in our police cruisers belongs to Chris Irons. The borough council appointed Officer Irons on November 16 after interviewing five very qualified candidates. Officer Irons graduated from the Morris County Police Academy as an alternate route candidate and served as vice president of his class. Please join me in welcoming him to Mendham Borough!

At its December 7 meeting, the borough council approved an ordinance amending our historic district to include properties on Hampton, Bridge and East Main Street. This was part of phase one which aligns the borough's existing historic district with the existing borough national historic registry listing. The implementation of phase two will begin in early 2010 and further updates will be provided as needed.

Also at the December 7 meeting, Mr. John Anderson, our regional manager from Jersey Central Power and Light, addressed several issues the borough recently brought to JCP&L. Firstly, Mr. Anderson agreed to work with the borough through Ellen Sandman to revise the street lamp program. JCP&L has been replacing incandescent lamps with sodium vapor lamps. Our goal is to minimize the effect these lamps have on our residents and the character of the borough. Secondly, Mr. Anderson assured the council that JCP&L will work to identify why the borough has experienced an increased number of power surges.

A meeting was held recently with representatives of the West Morris Regional High School district to discuss future joint funding for a school resource officer from the borough's police department. The regional school board is now reviewing their compensation contribution to the borough for the police officer for the next three years. We are hopeful that only slight modifications will need to be made to our agreement.

Administrator Sandman and I met with various professionals and members of the planning board to review

the draft of an occupancy ordinance which I hope to present to the borough council in early 2010 for adoption. Our next meeting will be held in early January to finalize the necessary documentation as well as the implementation timeline.

The borough council has completed budget workshops and will now incorporate feedback from department heads to formulate the operating, capital and salary portion of the 2010 budget. Specific details of the budget will become clearer once final numbers are issued to us from the state of New Jersey in spring 2010.

In closing, I would like to ask all borough property owners to remember to help their neighbors and fellow residents by cleaning snow off their sidewalk as quickly as possible after a snow storm. While the borough does not have anything in our code which requires snow removal, it does make it safer for pedestrian traffic to move through town if all our sidewalks are cleared on a timely basis.


### Mendham Borough Board of Education
