## Mayor's Update

Dear Residents and Business Owners:

Spring is almost here and it can't come quickly enough.

Our Department of Public Works worked long and hard this winter to plow the excessive snow and keep our streets and parking lots clear. I would like to thank them for a job well done!

Recently there have been a number of newspaper articles about "shared services" with neighboring towns. I want to assure the community that the Borough Council and administrators are diligent in their consideration of whether new local arrangements will make economic sense for Mendham Borough.

We are, in fact, already actively involved in many shared service arrangements with neighboring communities. The Joint Court of the Mendham's is the municipal court we share with the Township of Mendham, which runs smoothly and efficiently. We are also in agreement with the Bernard's Township Health Department for health services. We are members of the Morris County Joint Insurance Fund and we are members of the Morris County Emergency Communication Center. We also have an inter-local agreement with the West Morris Regional School Board to provide a school resource officer at Mendham High School. We participate in a mutual aid arrangement with neighboring police and fire departments. Finally, we employ the same building code officials as Mendham Township.

The Mayor and Council expect to come to an agreement with the Township of Randolph to share their animal control officer soon. We expect this will provide much better service than we have been receiving from St. Hubert's. There has also been some initial conversation about contracting with the County of Morris Welfare Assistance Department. As arrangements are finalized, I will provide further updates.

Work continues on our 2010 budget and, as of this writing, the council's finance committee is now looking at the capital expenditure and salary portion of our

budget. Our goal is to introduce the budget early this spring after receiving confirmation on state aid numbers.

I expect the occupancy limitation ordinance which has been developed by a sub-committee of the planning board to be introduced during the month of March. The Mayor and Council are also exploring ways to make the sign ordinance more business friendly during these tough economic times.

The Mayor and Council expect to receive an update from the Tax Assessor, Scott Holtzhauer, during the month of March. We are also in line to receive a presentation on a potential 2010 Harvest Run this fall.

Finally, I would like to officially welcome back Sgt. Pasquale Libertino, who returned to duty in early February. Pat suffered life threatening injuries in a motorcycle accident in August and I am sure I speak for all of our residents when I say it is great to see Pat back in uniform patrolling our streets and serving our residents.

## Book Review


### *Half-Life by Roopa Farooki*



It's time to stop fighting, and go home. Those were the words, written by a minor but well-reputed Bengali poet, that finally persuaded Aruna Ahmed Jones to exit her ground-floor Victorian flat wearing only jeans and a t-shirt, carrying nothing more substantial than a handbag, and keep on walking. Leaving behind the handsome Dr. Patrick Jones, her husband of less than a year, Aruna heads to Heathrow, where she boards a plane bound for Singapore, and her old life. When Aruna left for London, she was fleeing many things: her recently deceased father, the only family she'd ever had; her best friend and lover, Jazz, and the life they'd tried, and failed, to create together; the complicated psychological diagnosis she preferred to forget. But after years of fleeing the ghosts that continue to haunt her, Aruna is about to discover that running away is really the easy part; it is coming home—making peace with Jazz, with her past, and even with herself—that is hard. With shades of *Slumdog Millionaire* and *The Namesake*, Roopa Farooki's novel is luminous and gripping.

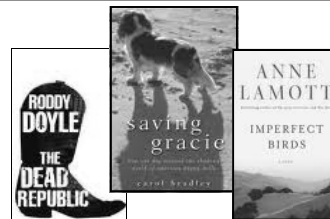

*Checkout ListenNJNW.com!*

Check out ListenNJNW to learn more about downloading free audio-books for your computer, Ipod, smart phone or other MP3 player. Just go to [www.mendhamboroughlibrary.org](http://www.mendhamboroughlibrary.org) and click on the Online Resources link at the top of the home page. Once at the ListenNJNW website, you will need to download the Overdrive Media Console software to borrow books for your audio device. Detailed instructions are available on the website and at the library.

### *Searching for Audio Books and checking them out*

Searching for a specific title or author? Just type the information into the search bar on the ListenNJNW home page. Just browsing? There are titles listed on the NJNW homepage in a variety of categories including New Arrivals, Always Available and Popular Titles.

Once you have found the book you want, click on the Book Jacket to view a description of the book and to find information on its availability (transfer to MP3 or burning to CD).

### *How many titles can be checked out at the same time?*

You can have up to 5 titles checked out at one time. These titles remain on your account for the full borrowing period and cannot be returned early.

### *What happens once the 14 day lending period is over?*

Once the lending period has elapsed, the title is automatically 'returned' to the library. Although the file(s) will remain on your machine, they will not be accessible and should be manually deleted from your portable device or computer.

### *Can I renew my items?*

Your items cannot be renewed, but you can check them out again if they are available when your checkout expires. When you check out the title a second time, the license is reactivated. Simply click the 'Download' button at this website to download a new license. You do not need to download the title a second time if the file is still on your computer.
