ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Council Member Andrew reported that all borough parks are closed.

Board of Education

Council Member Andrew reported that Mendham Borough schools have implemented remote learning and further reported that the West Morris Regional School District introduced its budget for the 2020-2021 school

Public Safety [Standing Committee of the Council]

Council Member Andrews reported that the OEM Task Force has been meeting remotely and has been in communication with Holly Manor, MASH, Police, Fire, EMS and OEM personnel. He further confirmed that PPE gear has been procured and thanked Carolynn Budd for continuing to assist OEM with its procurement needs.

Personnel [Standing Committee of the Council]

Member Martin reported that interviews for a part-time tax collector have been postponed at this time due to COVID-19 declaration of emergency and will be rescheduled at a future time.

Public Works and Utilities [Standing Committee of the Council]

Council Member Kelly reported that the committee met last week to review the proposed professional services contract for interim licensed wastewater operator and collections systems operator services for the Borough's Water Reclamation Facility. He mentioned that the professional services contract must be approved by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and further noted there will be cost-savings by contracting for the mandated licensing services.

She thanked Council Member Kelly's spouse, Frederica, for suggesting that the town hang the flags along Main Street and also thanked the DPW for hanging the flags. She invited all residents and local businesses to display their American flags to show support for first responders as they provide essential services for the well-being of everyone.
