# **ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT**

Ms. Bushman distributed a copy of her Administrator's Report dated September 29, 2020. She further reported that the new version of the Borough website went live next week, and that the Day Camp website will be migrated over to the Borough website soon. She also mentioned that the CCTV inspection of sewer lines has been completed and that three areas of concern were found, which will be addressed. Ms. Bushman thanked the interns who have been scanning records to the Borough server in efforts for the Borough go paperless.

### **COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS**

## Finance [Standing Committee of the Council]

Council President Badal had nothing new to report.

## **Board of Health**

Council Member Andrew that the Bernards Township Health Department continues to monitor and report on COVID-19 cases in Mendham Borough and further reported that the health department has had to delay the seasonal flu shot clinics originally scheduled for September and October due to the vaccine not being available from the manufacturer. Updated flu shot clinic dates will be posted on the Borough website.

### **Recreation and Parks [Standing Committee of the Council]**

Council Member Andrew reported that the Food Truck Festival is scheduled for October 3<sup>rd</sup> from 11:00am until 7:00pm. Attendees and participants will be required to wear face masks and hand-sanitizing stations will be prominently available. He also reported that on October 31<sup>st</sup> the Recreation Committee will host a Halloween Pet Parade.

## **Board of Education**

Council Member Andrew had nothing new to report.

### **Public Safety [Standing Committee of the Council]**

Council Member Andrews reported that the Public Safety Committee met on September 28<sup>th</sup> and advised that the "Your Speed is" radar sign has been moved to Hilltop Road and further reported that the Police Department has ordered two additional "Your Speed is" radar signs for use in the Borough. He also reported that American Water Company has scheduled a water main project on Cold Hill Road in October.

Lastly, Council Member Andrews reported that an official Ballot Drop Box will be installed outside the Police Department by the Morris County Board of Elections. Voters can choose to return their completed ballot to the Ballot Drop Box, which is available 24/7.

### **Personnel [Standing Committee of the Council]**

### **Public Works and Utilities [Standing Committee of the Council]**

Council Member Kelly was absent.

## Land Use [Standing Committee of the Council] and ECOSST Committee

Council Member Reilly had nothing new to report.

#### **ATTORNEY'S ITEMS**

Mr. Semrau advised that Mendham Borough's affordable housing Compliance Hearing was held on September 18<sup>th</sup> before Judge Gaus in Superior Court. At the conclusion of the hearing, he advised that the Court entered an opinion finding that Mendham Borough had provided a compliant Third Round Affordable Housing Plan and confirmed that Judge Gaus had entered a Judgment in favor of Mendham Borough at the conclusion of the hearing.

Mr. Semrau further advised that Judge Gaus recognized the Borough's commitment to affordable housing and was very complimentary with how Borough officials continued the process and public hearing throughout the challenges brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic and having to conduct remote meetings.

Mr. Semrau thanked the Mayor, Council and Administrator for their thoughtful and reasonable approach in addressing the Borough's Third Round Plan and thanked Jessica Caldwell for her role and experience as a professional planner in handling this matter on behalf of Mendham Borough.

## **MAYOR'S ITEMS**

Mayor Serrano-Glassner reported that new bid specifications will be prepared for solid waste, bulk waste and recyclable material collection. She also reported that she attended a meeting with the President and Chief Executive Officer of Daytop and mentioned that Daytop facility in Mendham is planning on re-opening as an adult addiction recovery facility. An application will likely be presented to the Planning Board next year.
