Regional High School District Funding History

1956: Regional High School District founded, with funding formula

based 100% per pupil

1975: State law mandates that funding for regional districts must

be based 100% on Equalized Valuation

1993: State law provides that pre-1993 districts can change funding

formula upon approval by the majority of voters in each and

every constituent municipality

Currently, the Regional High School District is funded 100% based on Equalized Valuation









Equalized Valuation

- Calculated by the NJ State Department of the Treasury
- Compares assessed values to current market values in each municipality in order to equalize values across the county
- Serves to mitigate issues that arise because municipalities reassess properties in different years
- Seeks to ensure that each municipality equitably contributes to local and county government









Regional Equalized Valuation
