From the Shade Tree Commission

Annual Tree City USA Tree Planting Program

Every Spring and Fall, the Borough's Shade Tree Commission, as part of its Tree City USA Program, plants about 15 to 20, 2.5" caliper shade trees.

The Shade Tree Commission's goal is to involve the community in the Tree City USA tree planting program and better our environment by



providing a tree canopy and keeping Mendham's beautiful streets tree-lined.

Working with property owners, the Commission picks locations that are in the Borough right-of-way or up to 10 feet back from the right-of-way within a property owner's front or side yard that lines the street.

- ♦ All trees are choice specimens and perfectly placed.
- ♦ The trees are planted, staked, mulched, and trunks deer-proofed by the Borough's Department of Public Works.
- ♦ If a tree is placed on your property or in front of your house in the ROW please look out for it:
 - ♦ Please give it water during dry spells and even some free wood chips for the asking from the Borough DPW.
 - ♦ Please do not weed whack the trunk and keep dogs and trash cans away.
