Letter From the Mayor

Dear Mendham Borough Residents and Businesses,

I never like to say goodbye to summer, but with the warm autumns we have had recently I may not have to do so for many weeks to come! Hopefully this fine weather will continue all the way through to Mendham Fest! Mark your calendars for Saturday, October 7th—I will see you there!

Farewell to a Dedicated Public Servant

In June, long serving council member Brad Badal sold his Borough home and decided to head south for warmer weather. Brad has been dreaming of leaving our cold winters behind for a few years, so this did not come as a surprise. We are extremely grateful to him for his 14+ years of service to Mendham Borough and we know that he will find true happiness in not having to shovel his front walk anymore. Best of luck to you Councilman Badal!

What happens next? When a Council member leaves before their term expires there is a specific legal process that the State provides for Municipalities to follow. The Council member submits their letter of resignation to the Council, and at the next meeting the Council adopts a motion to accept that action. Whichever political party the outgoing member represents, the local committee of that party submits up to three candidates for Council to consider as a replacement. Once the candidates are presented to the Council, the members discuss the matter and take a vote on the candidate who will fill the remainder of that term. The winning candidate is then sworn in and welcomed as our newest Mendham Borough Council member.

Welcome New Council Member

I hope you will join me in welcoming our newest Council member, Dr. Marilyn Althoff. Marilyn has served our Mendham Borough community in some very important ways. If you have ever had the need to go to the Emergency Room in Morristown, chances are you may have been tended to by Dr. Althoff. She and her husband moved to Mendham Borough more than 30 years ago. At that time, she took a position as an Emergency Room Physician at the Morristown Memorial Hospital, now known as Morristown Medical Center. I met Marilyn when her husband Sam stepped up to be coach for the High School girls' fencing team in Mendham some years ago. I knew she would be a great volunteer for our Borough Board of Health the moment I met her. A spot on the Board came open around the same time the pandemic arrived. Although she was extraordinarily busy saving lives at the hospital, Dr. Althoff always made time to offer advice on best practices for Mendham Borough. Soon her peers on the Board voted her in as President.

Marilyn is a thoughtful, caring professional and we are very fortunate to have her on Council to finish out the term for the remainder of the year.

More Mendham History

The Council recently approved the formation of the Mendham Borough Mayor's Ad Hoc Historic Committee. This committee will serve to support our Town Historian, Bill Maurer, by hosting events, walking tours, and more. We will post a notice for the first meeting to be held in September. Lithium-Ion Battery Safety Information

As Mayor I receive information daily about all sorts of interesting topics. Sometimes we all get so comfortable in our day-to-day lives that we forget hidden dangers that could be lurking around every corner. A recent notice that I received from the NJ Department of Consumer Affairs contained information I think is worth sharing:

The public is using an increasing number of lithium-ion batteries in devices such as smartphones, laptops, e-cigarettes, e-bikes, cars and more, due to their ability to store a significant amount of energy in a small space. While they are safe to use and offer many benefits, if handled improperly they could explode and cause extreme fires. This dangerous situation increases when these batteries are damaged or improperly used, overcharged, or improperly stored. By following safety guidelines, you can mitigate the potential risks. 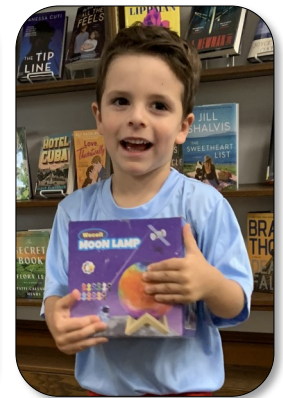
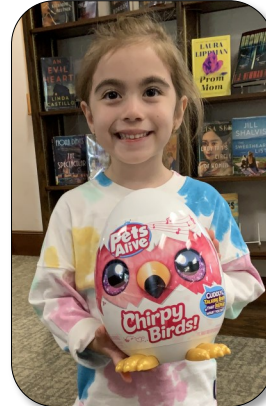
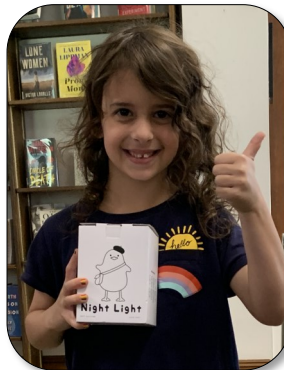
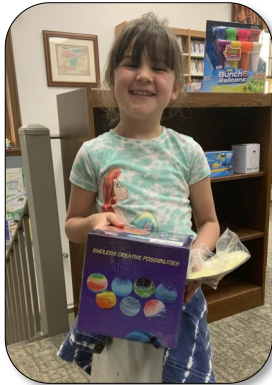
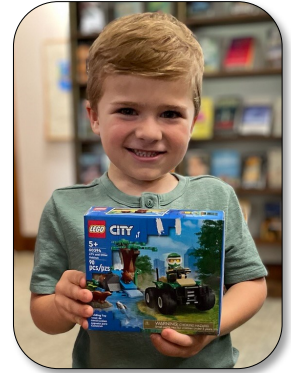
New Website

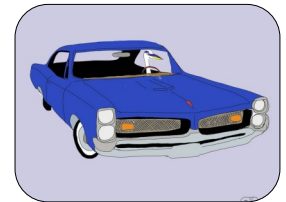

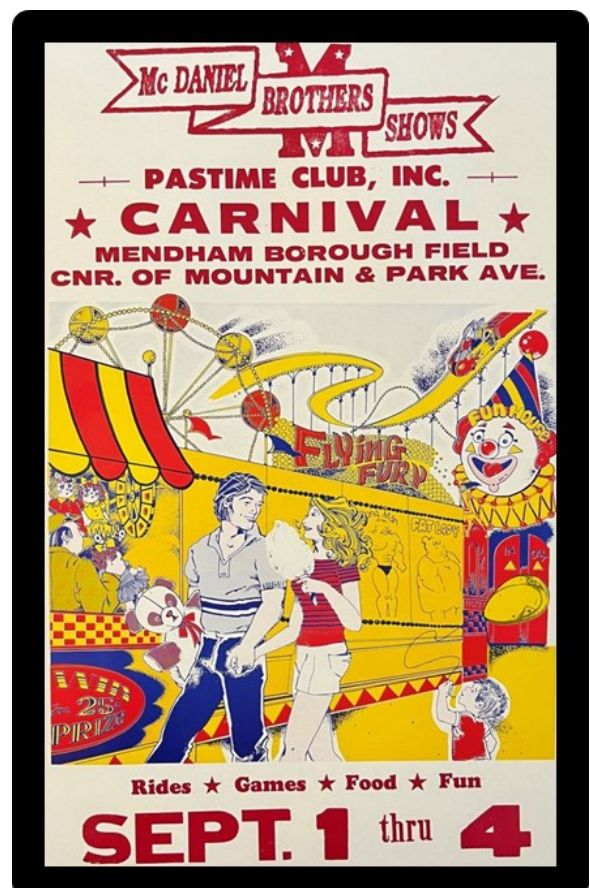
