From the Department of Public Works

Merry Christmas, Mendham Borough Residents!

It is that time of year again when the DPW aids in Christmas tree disposal. Starting December 26th, trees



can be dropped off at Borough Park. The DPW will also be picking up Christmas trees curbside.

Please keep in mind that the trees must be free of tree stands, tinsel, lights, and ornaments before discarding the tree.

We cannot accept wreaths or roping pine due to the metal wire that holds them together. Please do not place your tree in a plastic bag, as this cannot go through the chipper.

Residents are encouraged to drop off their Christmas trees at Borough Park; this is very helpful to the DPW. By dropping off trees at Borough Park, trees will not be sitting curbside and potentially blowing into the road.

Trees will be chipped, and wood chips are available at the Public Works for pick-up or delivery.
