Mayor's Update

Dear Residents & Business Owners:

I would like to share with you my remarks from the Mendham Borough Reorganization Meeting which was held on January 7, 2014.

The Mayor and Council accomplished quite a bit during 2013. Some highlights include the following:

- 1) A municipal budget with only a very minimal increase to our operating budget and yet another significant debt service payment. Overall, we are continuing to work down our debt significantly.
- 2) A number of changes in response to the "lessons learned" during Superstorm Sandy. We launched the Citizens Alert Program in conjunction with the County of Morris. We were awarded a grant to fund generators for the Wastewater Treatment Plant and the Garabrant Center. If needed during future storms, the Garabrant Center which will be converted into a full-fledged warming and charging center once the generators are installed.
- 3) Another glowing review from the State of New Jersey on our Wastewater Treatment Facility.
- 4) Upgrades to our summer day camp including a swimming program at the Mendham Health and Racquet Club.
- 5) Continued cost savings as we assessed different components of our day-to-day operations. This year's review resulted in a significant savings by way of a shared service agreement with the Borough of Chester for the use of their municipal court.
- 6) The placement of Mendham Borough's Historic District on the State Historic Registry.
- 7) The long awaited opening of East Main Street's Tranquility Park.
- 8) And last, but not least, the New Jersey Monthly Magazine Award which designated Mendham Borough the Number 1 place to live in the State of New Jersey. This designation just didn't fall into our laps. It was earned by all of us. Elected officials, members of our boards and commissions, all of our dedicated employees, first responders, residents and business owners all share in the credit of receiving this award.

As we begin 2014, we are considering other ideas to make further improvements to the Borough. Our 2014 goals include:

- 1) Keeping potential budget increases to a bare bones minimum. Each department head will be called upon to help us do this.
- 2) Identifying and implementing upgrades to the borough's accounting system to streamline and create better efficiencies in financial and human resources.
- 3) Reviewing needed upgrades to the police department's computer system.
- 4) Preparing a bid for recycling collection by mid-year.
- 5) Continuing to discuss potential cost savings through shared service agreements with all of our neighbors.
- 6) Working with the Townships of Mendham and Chester and the Borough of Chester to hire a qualified professional to conduct a feasibility study on a possible reconfiguration of our regional high school and perhaps even our local school systems.
- 7) Assess the possibility of applying for grants from Morris County for improvements to the Phoenix House and to help preserve open space on targeted properties identified by our Open Space Committee.
- 8) Explore the possibility of partnering with Mendham Little League to improve our baseball fields.



In closing, and as I say on a regular basis, it is a privilege and honor to continue to serve you as your Mayor. I would like to thank the members of the Borough Council, all of our professionals and dedicated employees as well as our first responders for serving with me as we continue to work to make Mendham Borough one of the best towns in the State of New Jersey.

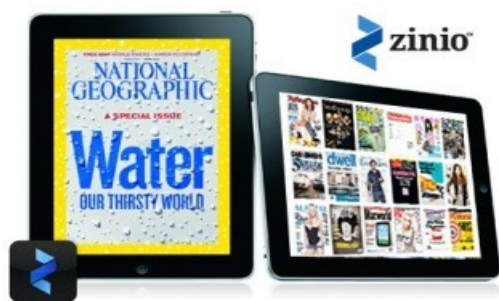

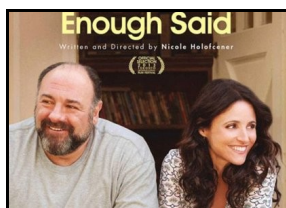

The system is county-wide and will provide information about multiple locations within Morris County including homes, workplaces and schools.

The Green Corner *Mendham Borough Environmental Commission News* Recycling Right



We all know recycling helps our planet, conserves natural resources and creates business opportunities. But it seems some people who think they're doing the right thing with curbside recycling are actually doing the wrong thing.

You may have been dutifully recycling Granny's pill bottles, not realizing these small plastic items damage the machines at the Mine Hill sorting center. Or you may have been putting shredded paper in a paper bag or adding plastic containers marked with 3's and 6's, which aren't acceptable.

With recycling, size matters. The smallest plastic container should be the 6 ounce yoghurt size. The largest recycling bin should be 32 gallons. Remember: S.O.S., Save Operators' Spines. And responsible recyclers know shredded paper goes in translucent plastic bags only.

The helpful folks at the Morris County Municipal Utilities Authority (MCMUA) are asking residents to please check the last page of their Town

Planner calendar for complete photo-illustrated recycling information and instructions. In case you mistakenly recycled the calendar (Oh no!) Cheryl, Kathy, Penny and Hazardous Tom are happy to answer your questions and/or settle arguments at 973-285-8390. The website www.mcmua.com has information and a video link. There are also specific instructions on the Mendham Borough website, www.mendhamnj.org, under the Recycling tab.

Please note that it is illegal in NJ to put out any television sets, desktop computers, computer monitors, laptops or tablets at the curb. Mendham has ongoing small electronics recycling at the Department of Public Works on Ironia Rd. They take anything but TV sets. Peggnet Computers on East Main St. recycles small electronics free of charge but charges \$20 for any device with a glass screen. Best Buy, Staples and Goodwill Industries say they will accept them, but call the store first to make sure.
