Mayor's Update

Dear Residents & Business Owners,

Happy New Year! I hope your holiday season was enjoyable and that you are now settling into your post-holiday, winter routine.

As we enter the New Year, I would like to welcome the two newest members of the Borough Council: Veronica Daly and Dave Sharkey. Ronnie and Dave, who were sworn into office at the Council's reorganization meeting on January 3, will bring new and valuable perspectives as we discuss various issues facing us in 2011.

I also wanted to take this opportunity to invite you to a public hearing and presentation on the Borough's proposed loop trail. This meeting will be held on Monday, January 24, 2011 at 7:30 pm in the Garabrant Center. I encourage all interested members of the public to attend this meeting.

While attending the New Jersey State League of Municipalities Convention in November, Borough Administrator Ellen Sandman had the opportunity to meet with TRC Energy Services of Woodbridge to discuss the New Jersey Clean Energy Program. After further discussion with TRC and the Borough Council, we have submitted an application for a \$20,000 grant to fund an energy review of all of our municipal facilities. This review would generate suggested improvements and would help us become more energy efficient. An additional \$30,000 could then be available to help install the recommended upgrades. Any additional energy efficiencies will of course result in dollar savings. The Board of Public Utilities recently deregulated New Jersey's supply of electricity in an attempt to break up a monopoly. There are now 27 companies authorized to provide electricity and the Borough is exploring the possibility of joining the Morris County SEM to help further reduce the cost of electricity. More information will be forwarded to you as it becomes available.

The Borough Council held its first budget workshop on Saturday December 11, 2010. We are still very early in the process and need more information before we begin to understand what cuts, if any, might be necessary. However, I do want to be clear that some of our

biggest line item expenditures are outside the 2% property tax cap which was recently enacted by the state legislature. The increase in pension payments (\$117,000) and debt service (\$70,000) are non-negotiable and must be paid. These two increases are essential starting points before we even begin to consider the operating, capital and salary portions of our budget. As I said, we are still early in the process and additional information will be forthcoming as work continues on the 2011 municipal budget.

Special thanks go out to Steve Zander of Zander Gutter and Contracting. Steve donated work and materials for the new gutters, which are part of the recently completed addition to the first aid bay at the firehouse. Also, a special note of thanks to Tom Stanley on his proposed Eagles Scout Leadership Service project on erosion management.

Mendham Makes the Match

Many thanks to the over 250 families who donated to the 2010 Annual Appeal for the library and helped us take full advantage of a \$15,000 matching fund. We called our fundraiser the Mendham Match because 21 families agreed to match donations dollar for dollar up to \$15,000 from the broader community. Gifts of all sizes then helped us realize the full match for a grand total of \$30,000. These funds enable the library to maintain our book, magazine and DVD collections and to provide quality programs for young and old. We are so grateful for the community's backing and hope you will take a moment to review our 2010 Match Donor Listing on the following page.

We have chosen names for each donor group based on the history of the library, which has existed in various forms since 1797. Our first category is named the Book and Thimble Club in honor of the library's earliest known fundraisers. In the early 1900s, this group would meet and read aloud to each other while sewing items for an annual fund-raising bazaar.

The Demarest Donors are so named after Mrs. Louise Forsythe Demarest, who in 1932 provided the funding for the construction and maintenance of our current building. The Fletcher Founders are named in honor of Andrew Fletcher whose gift in 1978 allowed us to double the size of our building.

From its beginnings the library has served all the citizens of Mendham and we continue this important mission with top quality collections, programs and services appropriate for today. We are so grateful for your support for this important Mendham tradition.

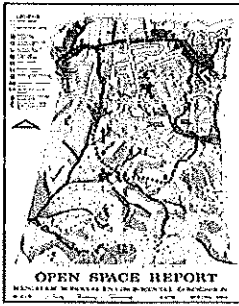

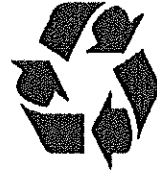
Additional Holiday Safety Tips from the Fire Department

- When you get your Christmas tree home, make a fresh cut in the tree's base and immediately place in water. Keep the tree's water container full at all times.
- Be extra careful with electricity, all open flames and other heat sources during the holidays.
- Check all Christmas tree lights, other electric decorations and electrical appliances for wear (frayed cords, for example). Do not use lights, decorations or appliances with worn electrical cords. Use only UL approved electrical decorations and extension cords.
- Place the Christmas tree well away from heat registers, space heaters, fire places, wood stoves, televisions, computer monitors and other heat sources.
- Place the Christmas tree clear of doors to keep the emergency escape route clear of trees, packages and furniture.
- Always unplug tree lights and other decorations when out of the room or sleeping.



How to Prepare Recyclables for Curbside Collection

Recycling's good for our planet!



Bottles & Cans

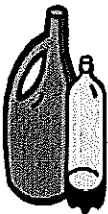
Put all of the following types of bottles, cans and jars together in a reusable container with a lid and handles.





Aluminum cans
Be sure to rinse. No foil or pie plates.



Glass bottles and jars
Clear, brown, green glass bottles and jars
No drinking glasses, mirrors, light bulbs, ceramic, window glass or Pyrex.[®]
Remove lids and rinse the bottles and jars.
No need to remove labels.



Plastic bottles coded  or 
Check for #1 & #2 on bottles only. Remove lids and rinse bottles. Bottles have necks or openings that are narrower than their bases. No buckets, toys, plastic bags or lids. No plastic containers other than plastic bottles.



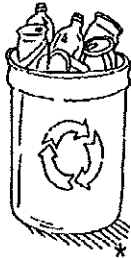
Steel (tin) cans
Rinse, but there's no need to remove lids and labels.



Paint and aerosol cans
Metal paint cans must be empty, dry and open with lids removed. Aerosol cans must be empty with plastic nozzles removed.



- ◆ Remove cap/lid.
- ◆ Put metal cap/lid into recycling container.
- ◆ Put plastic cap/lid into trash.
- ◆ Rinse all bottles and cans.
- ◆ Do not put recyclable bottles & cans into plastic or paper bags.



Paper

Put all of the following types of paper together in a reusable container with a lid and handles.



Newspaper
Newspaper no longer needs to be tied. If you prefer to bundle and tie newspapers, you may still do so; otherwise, put them into a re-useable container with all other paper listed.



Magazines, catalogs, coupons
Non-foil/non metallic gift wrap and carbonless paper.



Junk mail and envelopes



Office paper
Computer and copy paper, manila folders.
No metal clips. No carbon paper.



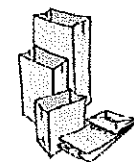
Soft-cover books
Soft-cover workbooks, paperback books, phone books and books with hard covers removed (put the hard covers into the trash).



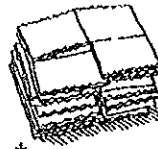
Chipboard and boxboard
Cereal and pasta boxes, gift boxes, notebook backings, egg cartons, cores from paper towels. No metallic coating of any kind. No beer and soda six/twelve pack cartons. No frozen food packaging. No gable-top milk/juice cartons. No juice boxes.



Brown paper bags (kraft bags)



Corrugated cardboard boxes
Empty and flatten corrugated cardboard boxes and put into the container with all other mixed paper. If the cardboard does not fit into a container, flatten, cross-tie or stack into a small box and place next to container. Remove all contents such as Styrofoam™ peanuts, blocks and plastic bags. Dispose of these items in the trash.

- ◆ Put materials at curbside the night before collection day.
- ◆ All recycling containers/receptacles should have lids and must have handles and must not exceed 50 pounds when full.
- ◆ Lids prevent materials from blowing out on windy days.
- ◆ Please label each container appropriately. Labels for your containers are available through your municipality at no cost.
- ◆ If you have a problem with your collection, you must call your municipal office no later than 10 a.m. the morning following your collection day.
