Mayor's Update

Dear Resident and Business Owners,

As some of you may know, Mrs. Ellen Sandman has resigned as Borough Administrator effective June 16 to become administrator in Parsippany-Troy Hills Township. For those of you who have worked with Ellen, you know that she likes a challenge and being able to "put the toothpaste back in the tube" as she has told me on many occasions. I am confident that Ellen will use her 40 years experience in local government to successfully address all of the new challenges she will face in Parsippany.

Shortly after becoming Mayor in 2006, I convinced Ellen to join the Mendham Borough government. For many reasons, the opportunity to work here came along at just the right time and, as she recently told me, she was glad to have been a part of our community for the last seven years. I wish Ellen the best of luck in her new position and am very grateful for her work in Mendham Borough. Ellen was instrumental in all of our recent awards and positive publicity and helped put Mendham Borough on the map. Thank you Ellen!

At its April 21 meeting, the Mayor and Council heard concerns from Orchard Street residents about the Mendham Audi dealership. Employees of Mendham Audi use their street as a parking lot and a "test drive" zone. This usage runs contrary to the site plan adopted by the Board of Adjustment in 1998 which prohibited overflow from the dealership. After the April meeting, Ellen Sandman and I spoke with Mendham Audi management and suggested that they use the municipal parking lots behind Robinsons Drug Store and Saint Marks Church.

They agreed to do so after the Council introduced an amendment to the Orchard Street parking ordinance. The new amendment prohibits parking along the entire east side of Orchard Street during certain hours. Special permits will be required for residents who wish to park on that side of the street in front of their homes during those hours. Proof of residency will be required when applying for these permits with Borough Clerk Maureen Massey.

The residents were pleased with this resolution. There will be a public hearing followed by a vote for final adoption at the May 19 Council Meeting (after this column was submitted for publication). I have instructed the Borough attorney to follow through with Mendham Audi and their representatives to adhere to their current site plan, or if they wish, apply for a new site plan approval.

The Mayors Ad-Hoc Committee received an additional proposal for the WMRHS feasibility study which will consider two possible re-configuration scenarios for the school district. A meeting will be held with this additional consultant, and we hope to award a contract during the month of June so that work on this project can begin.

Please join me in congratulating Dave Crotsley in his selection as the Grand Marshall of our 2014 Labor Day Parade by the Mayor and Council. Dave is a long-time resident of Mendham Borough, volunteer with the Mendham Fire Department, and was Superintendent of the Mendham Borough Public Works Department for many years.

Summer is almost here and we are looking forward to concerts and movies in Borough Park. Don't forget to check our website at www.mendhamnj.org for the event schedule and other important Borough information.

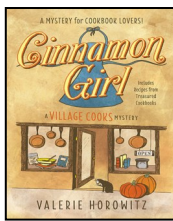
