#### Mayor's Update

Dear Resident and Business Owner,

This year feels like it went by too fast now that we are turning the page to December on our calendars.

#### Guess what's happening in December?

Mark your calendar for the annual Holly Trail, which takes place on Saturday December 4, 2021 all throughout Mendham Borough! The Mendham Business Association has been the generous sponsor of the Mendham Holly Trail event for the past couple of decades. It started out intending to get residents and visitors out and supporting our local small businesses. Over the years there have been games, singing, performances by local artists, presentations and much more. Businesses that have a large candy cane display outside their shop will have an event for the public to attend. Just a few of the festivities that you can expect are:

- For the two weeks leading up to the December 4th events, there will be a "Where's Santa?" happening. Candy Cane buildings will have Santa's Picture somewhere on the premises and when found just ask someone there to sign your Where's Santa paper. Participants can win Mendham Bucks\* when the completed paper is returned to Mendham Jewelers.
- There will be Santa and cookies at the Phoenix House with pictures taken by a photographer who will email free copies to the children's parents.
- Weichert Realtors has the Snow Princess telling stories to young children with cookies and hot chocolate for all.
- Candy Cane stores will have a box where your name can be entered with the possibility of winning more Mendham Bucks\* at the tree lighting.
- Look for signs at the Shopping Plaza to purchase gifts from the giving tree. Proceeds go to helping a local food bank.
- St Mark's Church will have a scavenger hunt and more.
- Finally, the event everyone looks forward to, the Fire Truck with Santa arriving at the Gazebo in Mendham Borough park and the MBA lighting of the Christmas Tree at 4:30pm.

#### Important seasonal messages to note:

Snow season is coming and our volunteer fire fighters who protect our town could use some help. If you have a fire hydrant on or near your property, lend a hand and help keep it clear of snow and debris. When they are called out to an incident, every minute matters. If they must take time to locate and uncover a hydrant, they are losing precious minutes and not focusing on their mission at hand: protecting you and your family. Want to find out more information or get involved? Stop by at the fire department off Main Street next to the Audi on a Sunday morning and find out

how you can be a part of your community.

A reminder that overnight on-street parking is prohibited from November 1 through April 15 from 2:00am till 6:00am. Help keep our streets clear during these winter months so our DPW can keep our streets clean of snow. If you find you are having a vehicle problem and can't move your car from the street, call the Police Department at (973) 543-2527 and speak with the dispatcher; they will be able to advise you.

Mendham is a walking town! Our residents love their morning jogs, their afternoon dog walks, and their evening strolls. If you have a sidewalk on your property, please do your best to keep it clear of snow and impediments. In particular, if your sidewalk is a pathway for our students to get to school remember that many of our students walk to school and a cleared sidewalk is the safest way to do that. Your community thanks you for your consideration.

#### Who's Who in Mendham

When our Borough students are walking along those snow-cleared sidewalks, who have we long counted on to make sure they are protected as they cross the intersection? No other than Wayne LeBlond! He so enjoys seeing the kids that he wishes more would walk more often so he could have more customers to cross safely.
