#### **ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT**

Ms. Bushman reported that the 2020 Financial Disclosure Statements are due April 30<sup>th</sup>. She further reported that bid specifications for solid waste, recycling and bulk waste collection have been finalized and thanked Jeanne Pugsley for her efforts. Ms. Bushman highlighted the following items reported in her April 9<sup>th</sup> Administrator's Report: The Daytop facility will close May 29<sup>th</sup> due to lack of funding; the Governor's recent executive order closes all non-essential construction projects and confirmed that work on the Borough's tennis court project and the Botti Pavilion at West Field Park has been temporarily suspended; Provident Bank will be providing two check reading machines to the Borough to efficiently process payments and deposits at no charge; the Recreation Day Camp Program registration form is now online with a payment engine; the deadline to file a tax appeals has been extended to June 1<sup>st</sup>.

Lastly, she reported that laptops have been purchased for the governing body's use and will be distributed in the coming week. The goal will be to digitize and email agenda packets, eliminating the need to prepare and deliver paper agenda packets. The cost of the laptops will be reimbursable under FEMA's state of emergency protocols.

Council Member Reilly inquired about the status of the county repaving the roads since the water main line replacement project has been completed by American Water Company. Jeff Cooper, Public Works Superintendent, will follow up with the county.

There was no further Council discussion.

#### **COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS**

#### **Finance [Standing Committee of the Council]**

Council President Badal reported that Resolution #066-2020 authorizing the issuance of tax anticipation notes and Resolution #070-2020 authorizing estimated tax bills for the 3<sup>rd</sup> tax quarter, were approved by the Council.

#### **Board of Health**

Council Member Andrew reported that the Board of Health met on April 1<sup>st</sup> and adopted BOH Ordinance #02-2020, Quarantine Rules and Protocols.

#### **Recreation and Parks [Standing Committee of the Council]**

Council Member Andrew reported that all borough parks are closed.

#### **Board of Education**

Council Member Andrew reported that Mendham Borough schools continue remote learning during the COVID-19 state of emergency and had nothing further to report.

#### **Public Safety [Standing Committee of the Council]**

Council Member Andrews reported that the OEM Task Force had met three times this week with Holly Manor, MASH, Police, Fire, EMS and OEM personnel. He further confirmed that the First Aid Squad is looking to procure additional N95 masks and size XL protective suits. The Red Cross has been contacted in efforts to schedule a blood drive in the Borough and reported that hospitals are in need of blood donations.

#### **Personnel [Standing Committee of the Council]**

Council Member Martin reported that interviews for a part-time tax collector have been postponed at this time due to the COVID-19 declaration of emergency and would be rescheduled at a future time.

#### **Public Works and Utilities [Standing Committee of the Council]**

Council Member Kelly had nothing new to report.

#### Land Use [Standing Committee of the Council] and ECOSST Committee

Council Member Reilly had nothing new to report.

#### **ATTORNEY'S ITEMS**

Mr. Semrau advised that his office continues to provide uninterrupted legal services despite the challenges presented by the COVID-19 state of emergency and the Governor's executive orders.

#### **MAYOR'S ITEMS**

Mayor Serrano-Glassner reported that a banner will installed at the Phoenix House to show community support during the COVID-19 state of emergency and further reported that the Borough and the Mendham Business Association will co-host Mendham's first "6' Apart Easter Parade" on Easter Sunday. Prizes will be awarded to the best decorated Easter bonnets/hats and face masks.

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Mayor Serrano-Glassner also reported on the Governor's recent executive order closing all state and county parks to the public. She confirmed the executive order includes Patriots Path, which runs through the Borough.

Mayor Serrano-Glassner reported that affordable housing ordinances are being prepared by Mr. Semrau's office with respect to the Borough's settlement agreement in the declaratory judgment action with the Fair Share Housing Center.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENT – AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION**

Mayor Serrano-Glassner opened the public comment portion of the meeting. Seeing and hearing no one wishing to speak, Mayor Serrano-Glassner closed the public comment portion of the meeting.

Council Member Reilly inquired whether the Borough would be closing the parking areas in efforts to discourage public access to Patriot's Path and Buttermilk Falls in Mendham Township. Mayor Serrano-Glassner responded that the Borough will consider closing these parking areas.

#### **APPROVAL OF VOUCHERS**
