# #13-2021 ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MENDHAM, IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING THE BOROUGH CODE TO PERMIT OUTDOOR DINING AND OUTDOOR SEATING TO FACILITATE SMALL BUSINESS RECOVERY NEEDED IN LIGHT OF THE COVID-19 PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY [Tabled from October 25, 2021]

Summary: Recent changes in the economy, including a public health emergency and resulting social distancing requirements, have led the Borough's Finance Committee to review outdoor dining requirements. The Governing Body desires to enable local restaurants and food and beverage service establishments, with appropriate guidelines, to serve customers and encourage social distancing requirements. This ordinance permits outdoor dining and outdoor seating and is consistent with the Borough's long-term Master Plan vision of protecting the small-town character of the community, while also helping to maintain a healthy business district.

Legal Notice Statement: Legal notices were published indicating that Ordinance #13-2021 was introduced and passed on first reading, as amended, at the September 9, 2021 and indicated the date, time and place of the rescheduled public hearings on said ordinance. At the October 25, 2021 meeting, Ordinance #13-2021 was tabled and the public hearing re-noticed to November 10, 2021. Copies of this Ordinance were made available to the public and posted in accordance with the law.

H. Outdoor Seating – An accessory use to a food or beverage service establishment that provides an outdoor location for patrons to sit; however, does not include table service *but can accommodate seven (7) or more people*.

### **ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT**

### **Discussion of the 2021 Best Practices Inventory**

The administrator reported that Mendham Borough scored 20.5 points on the 2021 Best Practices Inventory worksheets which qualifies the borough to receive 100% of its state aid funding.

Council Member Badal inquired why the Borough answered "No" to question #005:

Has your municipality adopted a capital program as defined by N.J.A.C. 5:30-4.2, meaning a moving, multi-year plan and schedule for capital projects (including prospective financing sources) and, when pertinent, first year operating costs and savings?

The Administrator responded that Mendham Borough did not adopt a 5-year capital improvement plan but would do so in the coming year.

A copy of the Administrator's Report dated November 10, 2021 was distributed to the Governing Body. There was no further Council discussion.

### **COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS**

### Finance [Standing Committee of the Council]

Council Member Badal reported that the Finance Committee is working on the 2022 operating and capital budget requests.

### **Board of Health**

Council President Andrews had nothing new to report.

### **Recreation and Parks [Standing Committee of the Council]**

Council Member Andrew reported that the Pastime Club will be holding its Veterans Day ceremony on November 11<sup>th</sup> from 3:00 to 6:00 p.m.

### **Board of Education**

Council Member Andrew had nothing new to report.

### **Public Safety [Standing Committee of the Council]**

Council President Andrews reported that on November 6<sup>th</sup> there was a house fire on Hilltop Road. He thanked all responding fire department's and further reported there were no injuries.

### **Personnel [Standing Committee of the Council]**

Council Member Martin reported that earlier in the meeting the Council passed Resolution #148-2021 updating the Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual.

### **Public Works and Utilities [Standing Committee of the Council]**

Council Member Kelly reported that the DPW garage has been installed and final inspections are scheduled. He also reported that DPW crews are draining water lines in advance of the colder winter months ahead.

### Land Use [Standing Committee of the Council] and ECOSST Committee

Council Member Reilly reported that a food drive and a GoFundMe account is being organized for the displaced family due to a house fire.

### **ATTORNEY'S ITEMS**

Mr. Semrau advised that the New Jersey State League of Municipalities (NJLM) would be holding an elected-officials session on best practices at next week's NJLM Conference. Elected officials attending the session earn a \$250 credit towards the town's MEL premium.

### **MAYOR'S ITEMS**

Mayor Serrano Glassner reported that she begun work on several appointments to the boards, commissions, and committees for the 2022 reorganization meeting agenda.

### **PUBLIC COMMENT – AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION**

Mayor Christine Serrano Glassner opened the public comment portion of the meeting.

Tony Reading, 24 Ironia Road, Mendham Township, inquired about the status of the 29 Ironia Road property.

Mr. Semrau advised that the use of the property is approved by the state and that the Department of Community Affairs has issued a license, regardless on whether the use is compliant with local zoning. Mr. Semrau further advised that his office is working with the zoning officer, construction officials, health officials, and the fire inspector to ensure life safety matters are in compliance.

Seeing and hearing no one wishing to speak, Mayor Serrano Glassner closed the public comment portion of the meeting.

### **APPROVAL OF VOUCHERS**

Bills List dated November 10, 2021. The Bills List had been posted on the website for full disclosure to the public.

The Council did not act on the approval of vouchers.
