WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have familiarized themselves with the contents of the above-referenced enforcement guidance and with their local unit's hiring practices asthey pertain to the consideration of an individual's criminal history, as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mendham that the Borough Administrator and the person who interviews and recommends candidates for employment with the Borough, must review, and be familiar with, the herein referenced federal guidelines and ensure that the Borough's hiring practices are in compliance therewith; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mendham hereby states that it has complied with N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5, as amended by P.L. 2017, c.183, by certifying that the local unit's hiring practices comply with the above-referenced enforcement guidance and hereby directs the Deputy Borough Clerk to maintain and make available for inspection a certified copy of this Resolution and the required affidavit to show evidence of said compliance.
